Accommodation

Accommodation can be located centrally and/or the suburbs of Budapest.

7 days/ 6 nights are included in a hostel, guest house, college dormitory, shared rooms are offered for students and single occupation for teachers/group leaders on a bed-and-breakfast basis.

Group leaders will be informed of all the necessary details via email 2 weeks prior to the commencement of the mobility.

Content: academic, social and cultural

These programmes include learning activities and cultural adventures especially developed for primary and secondary schools and other organisations in the field of school education with age-appropriate methodology.

Every 15-lesson mobility learning programme is centred around one or more of the main EU priorities: inclusion and diversity, Eco-mentality and environmental sustainability and digital education.

Easily comprehensible input-, collaborative sessions in the form of workshops, PBL activities and cultural visits form the programme. Students will enjoy the opportunity of learning about Hungarian culture, socialising with local students and/or students from other programme countries.

The challenges include the completion of the objectives in a non-formal learning environment: exploring a part or town, an attraction, a sight, a museum, a library or observing an aspect of Hungarian life.

These cultural discoveries ensure that participants immerse in Hungarian culture and will be able to compare and contrast it with their own.

On the final work day participants demonstrate their findings to the entire group in the form of a presentation. In other words, they show the result of collecting, selecting, analysing, using, adjusting, adapting data/information/content to create something valuable.

SIMPLY GREEN: BE CONSCIOUS-FEEL GOOD

Content

The challenges include the completion of the objectives in a non-formal learning environment: investigating, researching and observing what steps are taken in Budapest to meet the requirements of green citizenship. Students will visit an urban solid waste processing plant and/or water treatment plant. Expert guest lecturer(s) will deepen the participants' knowledge of current global environmental challenges, environmental protection, recycling and other relevant topics on demand.

These discoveries ensure that participants immerse in the different aspects of the topic and will hopefully become interested in investigating one particular area.

On the final work day participants demonstrate their findings to the entire group in the form of a presentation. In other words, they show the result of collecting, selecting, analysing, using, adjusting, adapting data/information/content to create something valuable.

Delivery Methods

Input sessions, field work, PBL activities, collaborative workshops and group presentations form the programme. The input sessions provide the setting for the discovery ahead by defining clear objectives and related tasks for the students.
